Collector

Make a collection to do with something that interests you, such as:

- postcards
- badges
- coins
- stamps

Arrange and, if necessary, label your items.
Tell the tester about your collection:

- how long you have had it
- where the items came from
- · what you like about it
- your favourite items
- · how you plan to extend it

Either -

know about the history of the items you collect;

or -

know about a famous collection or collector of similar items.

Visit two other collections, for example at a museum, art gallery, zoo or library. Describe your visits and how the collections were displayed.

Hobbies

Start a new hobby or develop an existing hobby over at least six weeks.

Tell your Patrol about your hobby and how long you have been interested in it. If possible, show examples of a collection or things you have made, or demonstrate what your hobby involves.

Explain the skills needed to pursue your hobby and what you have learned.

Discover more about your hobby by reading a book, visiting an exhibition, watching a TV programme or talking to someone else with the same hobby. Tell your Patrol or unit what you found out.

Find out the signs, symbols or traditions that link Guides and Girl Scouts around the world. Share the results with Guides in your unit, or with Brownies or Rainbows.






World Issues

Stamps inform about current social, political and economic issues.




















Stamps record events in the past. Use stamps in scrapbooks and reports.


